MINUTES OF DECEMBER 16, 1985 were approved as written on MOTION by Mr. Babcock. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR DECEMBER was accepted upon MOTION by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

DISBURSEMENTS included vouchers #1 through #293 and #501 through #604 and #701 through #705 totaling \$513,149.08.

December payrolls were:	Regular	\$558,314.60
	Work Study	\$ 13,892.27

A MOTION by Mr. Babcock approved the disbursements and transfer of funds and acknowledged the December payrolls. Affirmative vote unanimous.

TUITION WAIVER: was extended for dependents of the employees of the junior college district. The waiver is now extended to the spouse or dependent children of any full-time employee of the district. This would include all employees who are on the State Employee Retirement System. The MOTION was made by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Jerry Meyerhoeffer reported the following:

1. Terry Uhling reported that arguments have been made before Judge Hurlbutt on the public interest argument for the College of Southern Idaho geothermal water. They expect a ruling within 30 days.
2. North Campus Road: The city and other property owners are ready to resurface and complete the road on the north side of campus including a sidewalk. The college attorney expressed his opinion that the college would not be able to participate as a member of a Local Improvement District because of the fact that college property is nonassessable on the tax rolls.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT CONTINUED:

3. Liquor Funds: There is legislation being introduced to change the liquor bill. This could have important implications for the College of Southern Idaho. We now receive \$150,000 which could be lost if the present legislation is enacted.

4. Permanent Department Chairs have been selected. They will be given some special responsibilities for their departments.


5. We met some time ago with North Idaho to discuss the formula for distribution of the state appropriation. We met with them again this past week in Boise and the legislative fiscal officer has agreed to arbitrate and help us work out the formula for next year. This year will be divided on the old formula.

6. Two companies have contacted us on supplying food service for the College of Southern Idaho. We have checked out references for both companies and both were very excellent.


7. John Andreason and Mark Falconer of the State Legislative Fiscal Office made a presentation to the Joint Finance Appropriations Committee last week concerning the two community colleges in the state. Their report was very positive and they have put together a booklet that represents a study they made during the past year. The booklets were handed out to the trustees.

DR. LEHRMAN: Dr. Lehrman raised a question on traffic control when there are evening activities on campus. President Meyerhoeffer indicated he would look into the problem.
